



Paleolithic Excavations in Schafstall II in the Swabian Jura, between August 21st and September 29th 2017

The site of Schafstall II is located in the town of Veringenstadt, 10km north of Sigmaringen, in the Lauchert valley. Archaeological research in the Lauchert Valley at the beginning of the 20th century uncovered a number of Middle and Upper Paleolithic sites. After that, no further investigations were carried out. Archaeological fieldwork at Schafstall II will enable us to reinterpret part of the old excavations and possibly contribute to better understanding human occupation in this area throughout the Middle and Upper Paleolithic.

Excavations are open to excavators with field experience. Parallel to the fieldwork, team members will participate in water screening, sorting, labeling of finds and data management. Excursions to the neighboring sites and museums in the region will also be part of the program.

Place: Veringenstadt, Baden-Württemberg, Southwestern Germany

How to get there: Flight/train to Stuttgart, train to Veringenstadt. Depending on the departure time the train journey may require between 1 and 3 changes.

Conditions: Excavation experience and good command of English or German. Health insurance. Minimum period of participation is of four weeks. Accommodation and meals will be provided in local self-catering apartments. Travel-costs covered by the participants.
